

We see it in our personal and family finances and we see it in our church finances too. Our Church Council has been working hard on the church budget for 2024. Creating a church budget is never an easy process. During this time, I ask that you say some extra prayers for the Church Council as they continue to work on the budget. During our Congregational Meeting to vote on the budget in November, we will need to have some difficult conversations regarding church insurance and our benevolence to the NTNL Synod. Even though we face challenges, we cling to the abundance of God.

Letter to the Congregation

9-25-2023

BSLC Congregation:

When Marsha and I came to BSLC 25 years ago, we fell in love with this church and its people. Our feelings for BSLC have not diminished over the years and I'm sure most of you feel the same as we do. That being said, the Council has been working diligently on the 2024 church budget. We are facing some daunting challenges. Our church continues to have an imbalance with expenses vs income. We have been operating with a deficit budget for the last five or six years; the exception being the year when we did not have a full-time pastor. Last year we began with a \$20,000+ deficit. This year looks worse as we are projecting a deficit of \$25,000 - \$30,000. So how did we get here? 70% of our budget is in personnel – 20% is in property (which includes utilities). The other 10% is mainly Benevolence contributions to the Panhandle Conference and the Synod. At our last meeting, the Council cut over \$20,000 from line items that were in the 2023 budget: \$12,000 from Benevolence - \$7,000 in property insurance deductible buy down - \$3,000 in property. Our property insurance provider has now indicated that they may not reinsure us and if they do, it will be at a 25% to 30% increase. Our 2023 property insurance was \$26,000.

As the Council whittles away at the deficit, our expenses continue to skyrocket disproportionately to our whittling! BSLC has \$65,000 - \$70,000 in its checking account and that will be gone soon if we continue to have large deficits each year. The obvious solution is to lower expenses and increase income. As I stated earlier, most of our expenses are in personnel: Pastor Leah – Cheryl – Marsha – and Kristen (our janitor). I think we would all agree that our staff is essential to what BSLC is all about; serving God and our fellow man. Pastor Leah and I both felt that the congregation needed to be aware of our financial situation prior to our November Congregational Meeting. I will be happy to discuss any concerns that you may have and would also welcome any suggestions.




